#### Barriers to Accessibility that Remain | 1:00 PM- 3:00 PM

John Cleveland, Cleveland Civil Rights Consulting LLC

Paratransit in small urban and rural environments, after 30 years since passage of the ADA, have made gains in removing barriers to equitable transportation for people with disabilities and areas where best practices in accessibility have not been implemented and barriers remain. The two reports, "ADA Paratransit Services: Demand Has Increased, but Little is Known About Compliance", issued by the United States Government Accountability Office (GAO) in 2012 and "Transportation Update, Where We've Gone and What We've Learned" issued in May 2015 by the National Council on Disability (NCD) both cover a multi-year period that assesses progress forward and areas that have stayed in neutral, still presenting problems in accessible transportation for people with disabilities.

The last hour of this session will be "office hours" with John Cleveland. Bring your questions on ADA topics and he will be happy to discuss answers and solutions. Don't have a specific question? Feel free to sit in and learn from the discussion!
